<sup>3</sup> Kapoho, ‘ili ‘āina in the ahupua‘a of Waihe‘e, Maui. Literally means, the depression.

<sup>4</sup> Mauna ‘Ihi, sacred or revered hill. Sand dune in Kapoho, burial site.
